Volunteer Skill and Requirements:

- Have patience-some students take longer to reach their goals than others
- Have strong, fluent English communication skills (verbal and written)
- Be an excellent listener
- Be able to develop rapport and connect with learners
- Be sensitive to the needs of the learner
- Be able to work with people from diverse backgrounds
- Have an understanding of the needs of the student
- Be available for 2 hours per week for 6 -12 months per year
- Be able to take direction and work independently
- Create lesson plans that motivate and engage the student
- Keep organized records of contact with student
- Have basic computer skills

Training Required:

- All volunteers will complete TLG online training
- All volunteers will complete Laubach Certification Workshop (Certification Fee \$25.00)

Role Responsibilities:

- Maintain student confidentiality at all times
- Follow TLG's safety and privacy policies
- Deliver 2-3 hours per week of one-to-one tutoring
- Follow the individualized learner plan developed by the Program Coordinator
- Develop and deliver customized lesson plans based on the learner plan and resources provided
- Modify delivery style (with TLG staff assistance) to accommodate varying skills and needs of the student
- Encourage the use of written materials and technology during the tutoring process when appropriate
- Mentor the student in the use of technology for learning and life-skills purposes when appropriate
- Provide ongoing updates of student progress to the Program Coordinator
- Exchange best practices with other tutors and staff for further student and tutor development
- Inform the Program Coordinator immediately if an uncomfortable or emergency situation arises
- Inform the Program Coordinator immediately if taking a break from tutoring
- Provide feedback to TLG staff for continuous improvement of program
